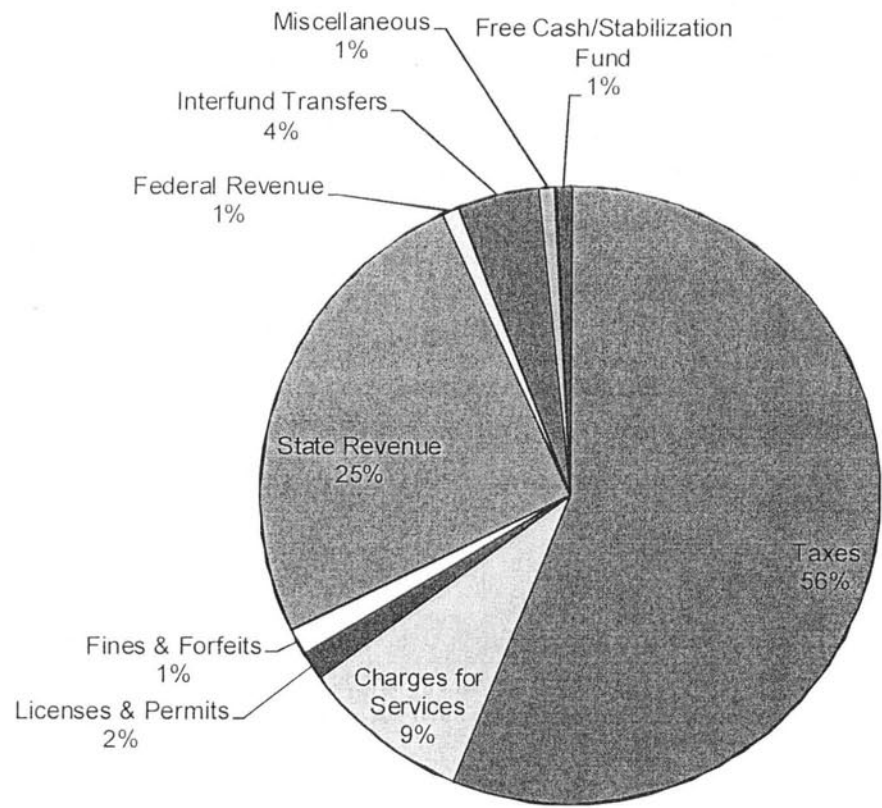


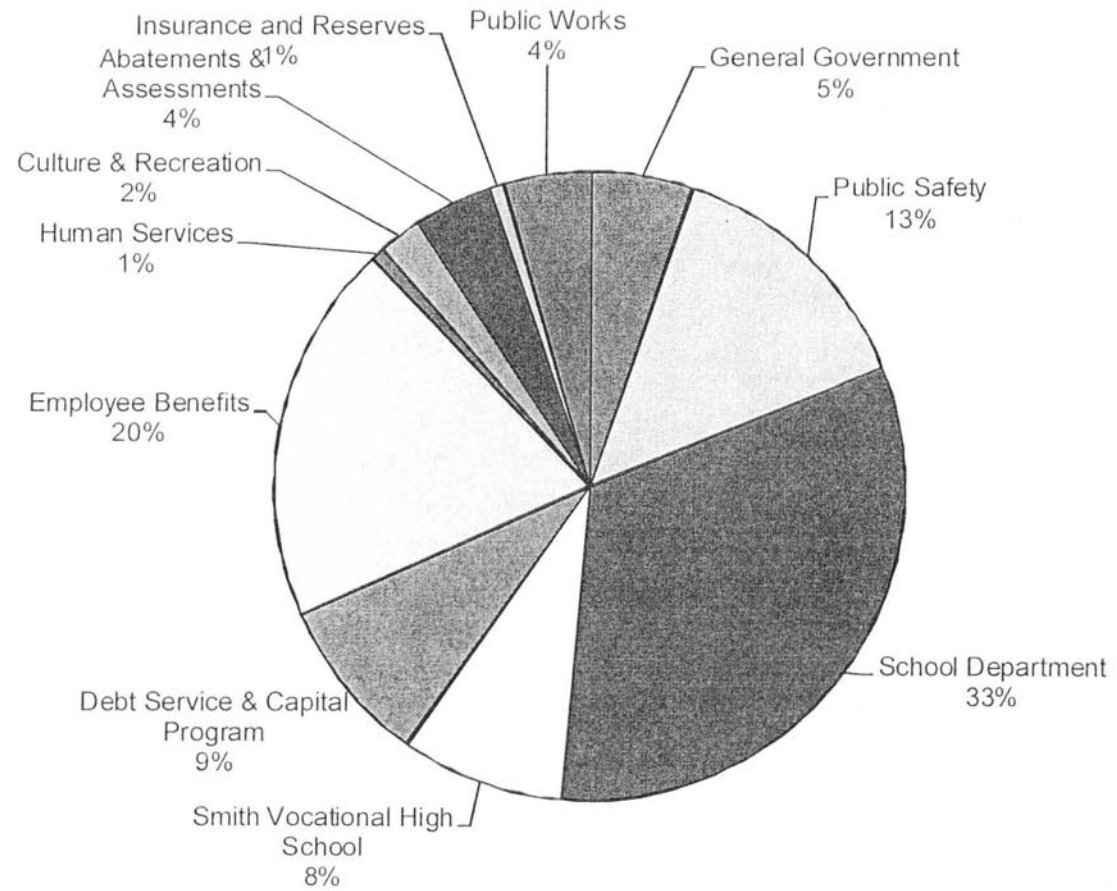
There are also some inter-governmental transfers and some income from fees and fines, but these are the main categories of revenue.

FY 2009 GENERAL FUND REVENUES

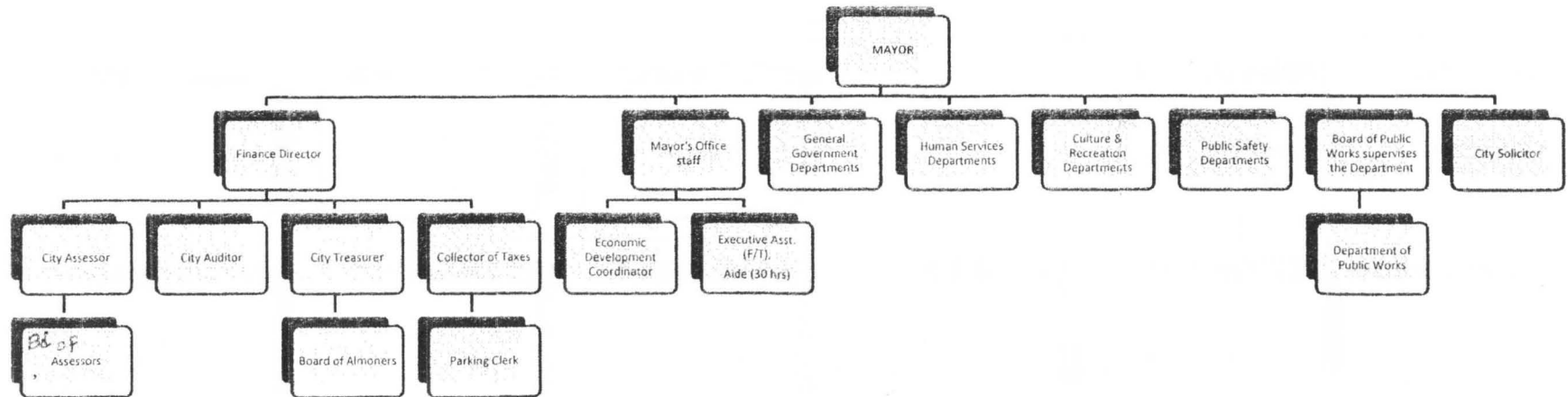


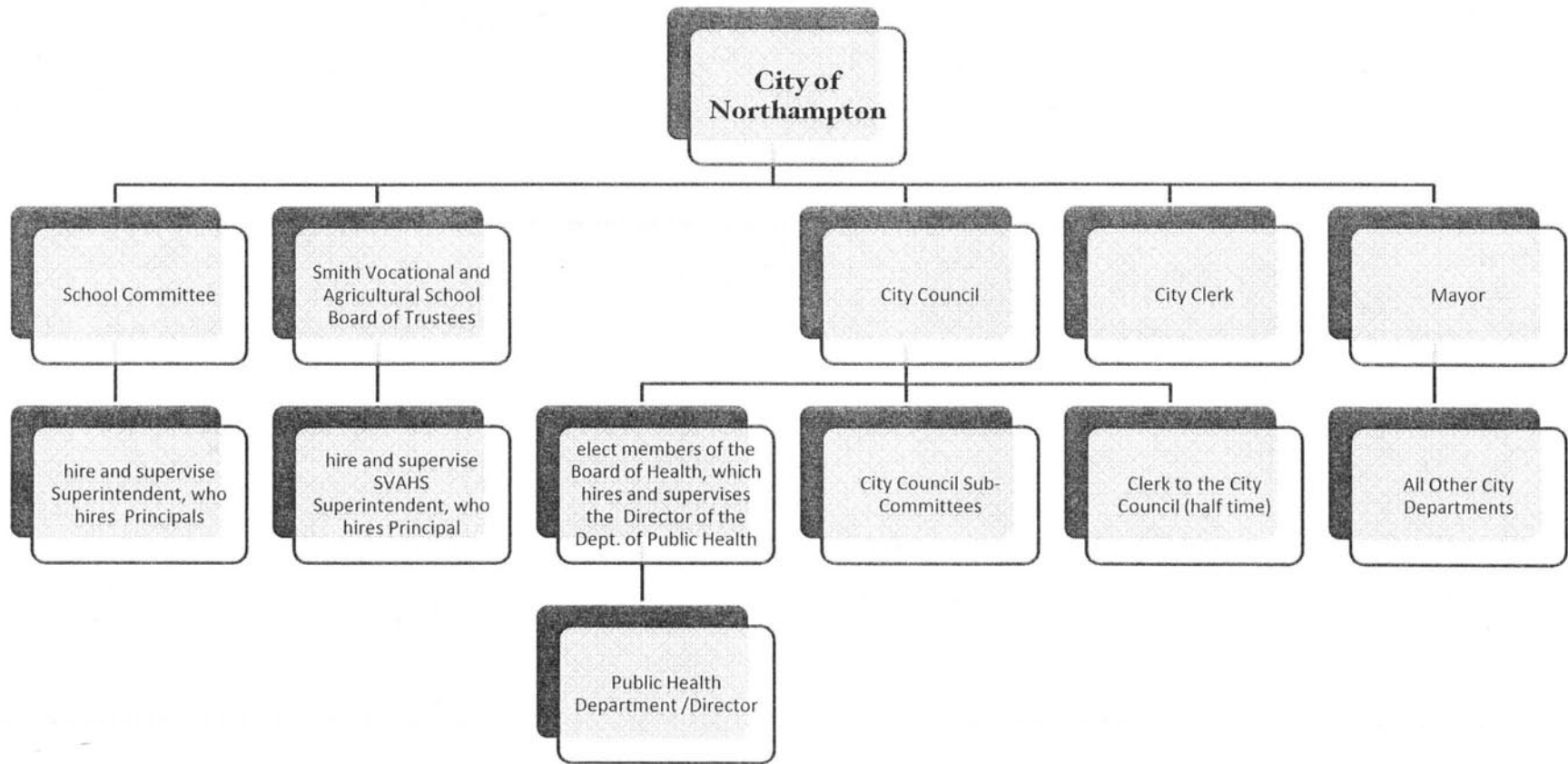
WHERE THE MONEY GOES...

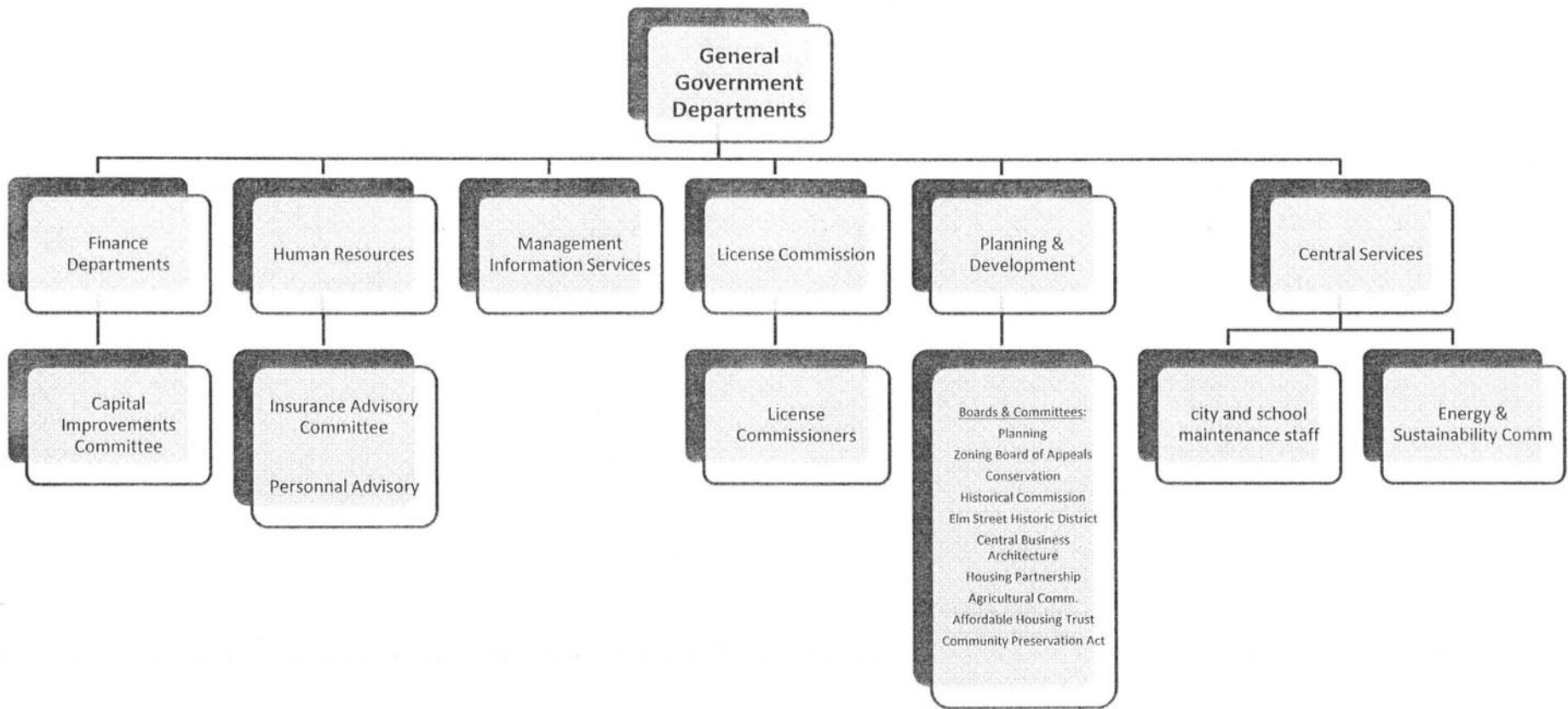
FY 2009 GENERAL FUND EXPENDITURES

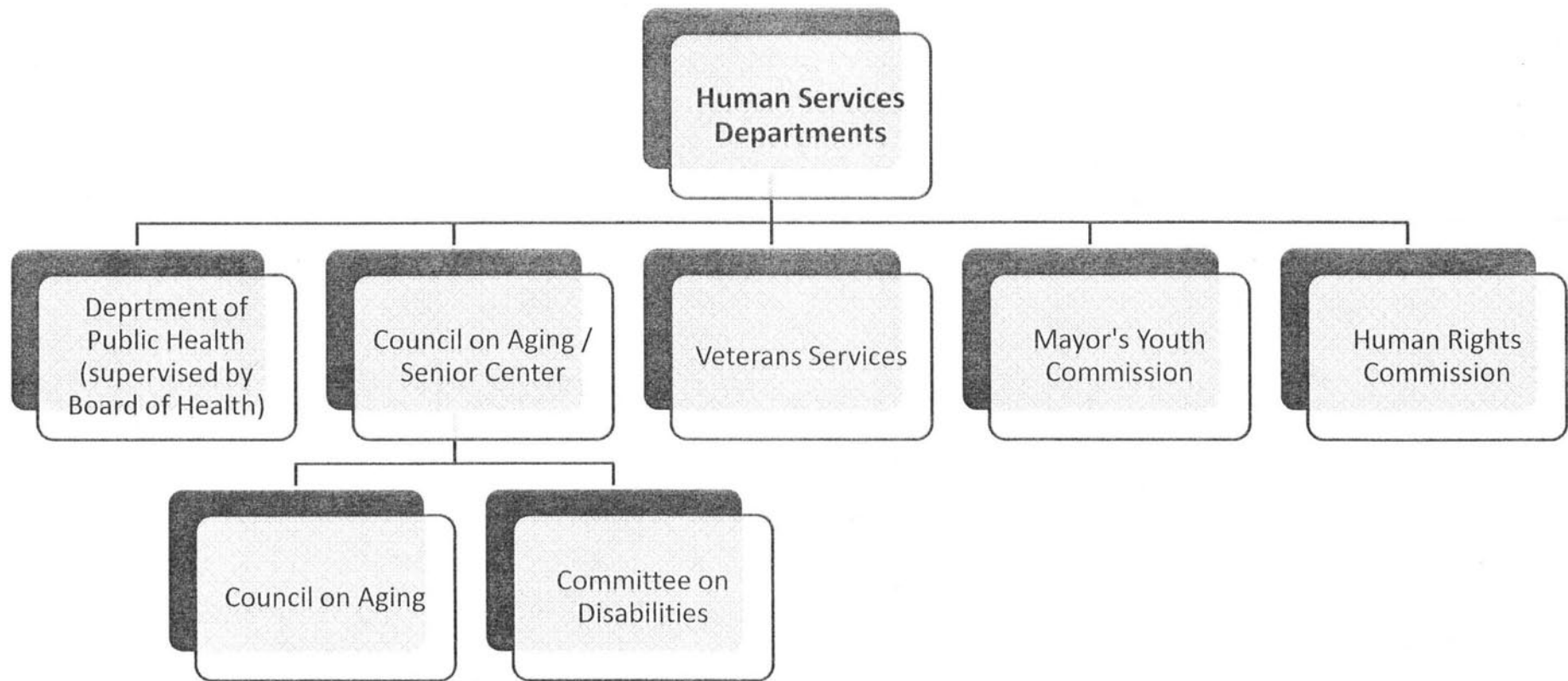


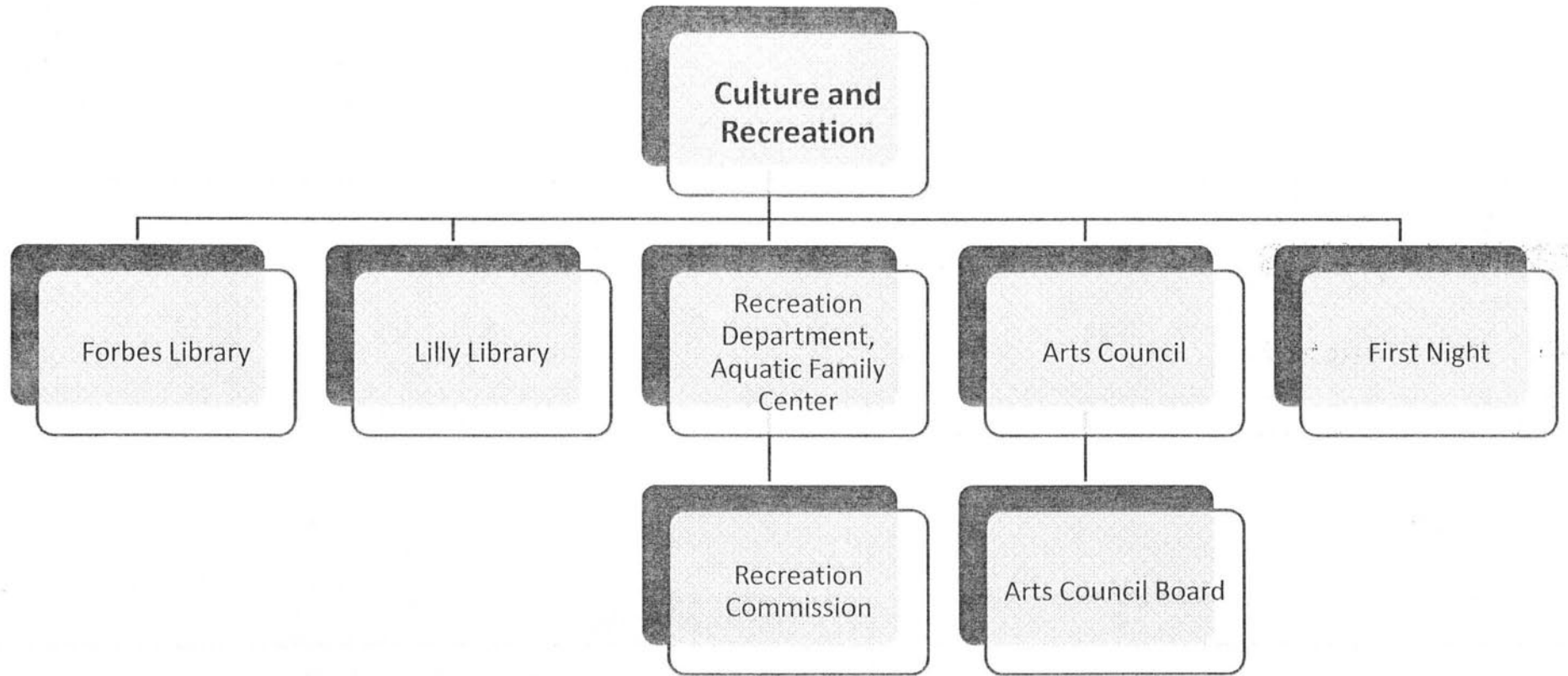
FINANCE STRUCTURE

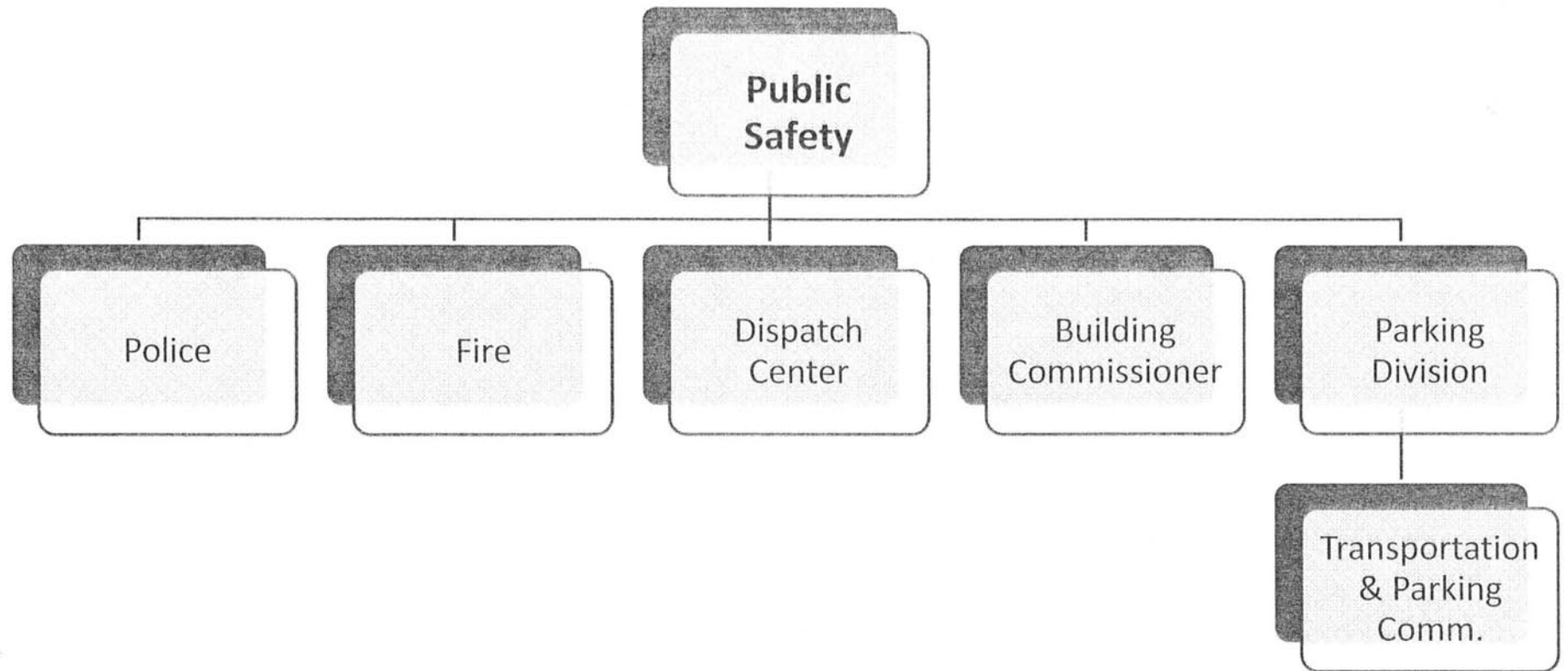


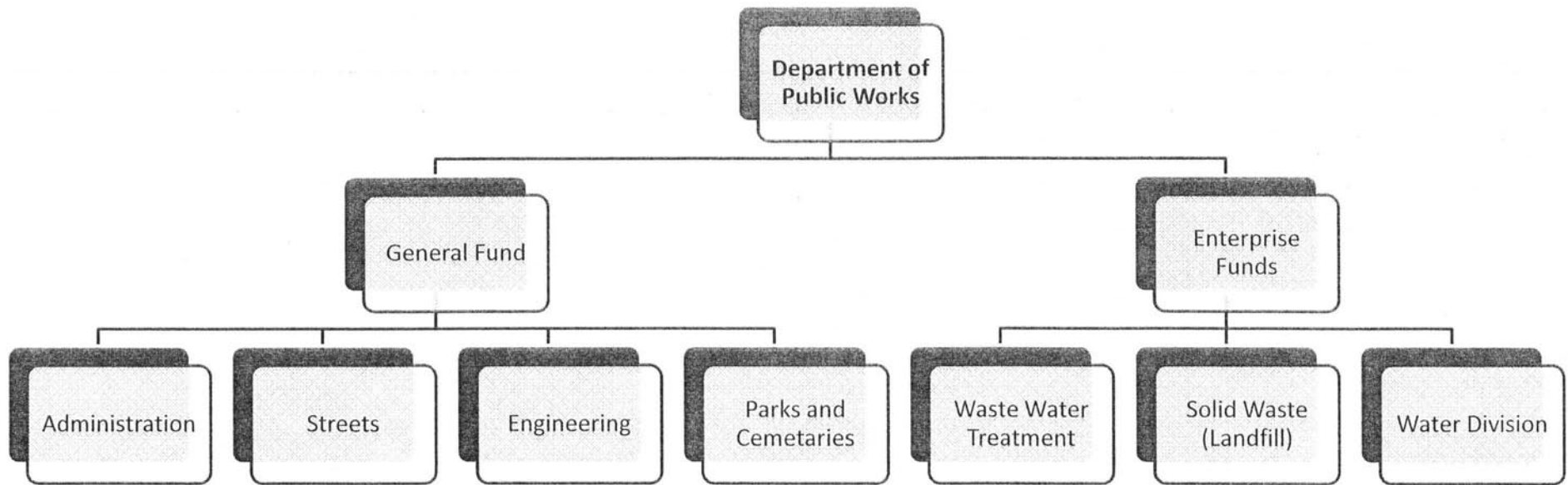















Ordinance is introduced to City Council, sponsored by City Councilor(s) Board, Department or the Mayor




City Council votes to refer the ordinance to subcommittee(s) for review, which consider, decide to recommend approval or not



Ordinance is returned to City Council with a recommendation. Council can vote to table it, approve it, or reject it (first vote),



At their next meeting, City Council can take second vote, again to approve or reject the measure



If City Council approves on two votes, Mayor either vetoes or signs into law (or it becomes law without signature after ten days)
